Non-Scholarship Payment Options

All Cash payment tuition will be at the discounted rate of \$7,200 per student. An additional \$1,000 discount is available for the second sibling only with cash pay.

Parents paying tuition in full by the first day of school will receive a 5% discount (first child only). Parents may also choose to pay tuition over a 10-month period beginning in August, which will include a \$5 per month processing fee.

Tuition Policy

Tuition payments are non-refundable and cannot be classified as a gift. Once a signed tuition contract is received, parents are obligated to pay tuition for the entire year. This policy ensures that the school can plan and provide the necessary resources to carry out its mission of partnering with parents to provide an excellent Christian educational experience.

Application Fee

\$100 per student. This is non-refundable and due with each application.

After School Daycare

Afterschool Care will be available from 2:45 – 5:30 PM on regular school days for a fee. See Afterschool Care Policy.

Late Enrollment

Students enrolling after the first 9 weeks will be charged a \$450 late fee.

Unpaid Tuition

Tuition is considered late if you miss your scheduled payment. If the account becomes delinquent, report cards will be held, and the child may be withheld from class until arrangements are made. Parents whose tuition accounts are delinquent will not be able to re-enroll their children without satisfying their previous debts. Payments must then be kept current for their child to remain on a class list.
